Overview

- The Jon Peterson Special Needs (JPSN) Scholarship provides scholarships to K-12th students that **have an Individualized Education Program (IEP)** from their public school district.

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FAQ

→ What can the scholarship pay for?

Students with a learning disability or OHI receive about 100 hrs of intervention at no personal cost.

→ How is the money distributed?

Each month the Provider bills the state for the services provided the previous month.

→ Where do the services take place?

Teachers meet at CHES Christian School, public libraries, or other schools as determined by what is mutually convenient for the family and teacher.

→ What do the qualified teachers work on during intervention service hours?

Teachers must address the goals of the IEP, but can sometimes use homework to do that.

→ How can I see progress for my child?

Progress Notes are uploaded quarterly by the Intervention Specialist in September, December, March, and June. These may be accessed through the OHID account.

→ How do I apply?

1. Create an OHID account.

2. Choose a JPSN Provider. (CHES Christian School is a provider.)
3. The Provider will give the parent an application. Parents will need to provide a birth certificate and a current proof of address, which the provider will upload. When approved, parents will need to sign the acceptance letter and allocation forms.

→ How do I renew each year?

The Provider will need a current proof of address and application to renew as long as:

- State Tests have been taken for grades 3-8. (The Provider organizes this.)
- The IEP is current.
